J.D. Salinger, Tolstoy, Chekhov, Richard Ford, among others.

The creative friction and contact between Anglo and Latino worlds is important to understand and illuminate.

6) Is there a specific purpose for your art?

Self-expression and the desire to connect with other humans.

7) Are there other artists that you collaborate with, network, or recommend?

Pretty much a solo flyer right now. Recommend to read: Either/Or by Elif Batuman.

8) Do you have a "real" job or is your creative work your fulltime gig?

Writing is my real job, but I have taken work in other fields to pay the rent.

Sometimes. I enjoy collaborating, especially on screenplays.

10) Tell us about an upcoming project you are working on currently?

Currently putting together the production of my screenplay Bullets Are Blind, a unique Western adventure featuring a spirited 12-year-old heroine and her idol, a writer of dime novels, who happens to be in prison...
